While it is now widely accepted that effective states are essential for promoting broad-based development, this thesis raises several questions:

What are the determinants of state effectiveness?

Why are certain states more effective in some parts of the developing world than in others?

What deliberate strategies might help improve state capacity to promote development?

Atul Kohli, David K. E. Bruce Professor of International Affairs at Princeton University, will discuss the determinants of state capacity across the developing world through a study of states that successfully promote economic growth as well as states that effectively facilitate redistribution. This analysis allows for speculation as to the types of states that might simultaneously promote growth and distribution, and thus be effective promoters of human development.
