## **ANDREW SELTH**

Andrew Selth is a Research Fellow with the Griffith Asia Institute, at Griffith University in Australia. He has been studying international security issues and Asian affairs for 35 years, as a diplomatic officer, strategic intelligence analyst and research scholar. In 2007, he was awarded a PhD by Griffith University, and a fellowship by the Australian Research Council to write a book about Burma's influence on the security of the Asia-Pacific region. Dr Selth has already published four books and more than 50 peer-reviewed research monographs, book chapters and journal articles, most of them about Burma and related subjects. His last major work was *Burma's Armed Forces: Power Without Glory* (Norwalk, 2002).
